At the request of Thomas Heald of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up one hundred acres of land near Brandywine — in the said County and next adjoining to one hundred acres lately granted to Hugh Crissey for which the said Thomas agrees to pay to the Proprietors use ten pounds and the usual yearly <sup>quit</sup> Rent of one shilling Sterling for the said one hundred acres of land. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said Thomas Heald in the place aforesaid the said quantity of one hundred acres of land that is clear of all other surveys and claims of other persons and make a return thereof into the Secretarys office which survey in case the said Thomas Heald fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seals of the Province at Philadelphia the 22 day of the Tenth Month Anno Domini 1714.
