At the request of Daniel Humphries of the township of Haverford That we would grant him a resurvey on two hundred acres of land Situate in the township aforesaid within the Welch tract laid out (by virtue of a General warrant from the Proprietary for surveying the said tract) in several contiguous parcels. One hundred and forty thereof in right of Thomas Ellis, thirty in right of Lewis David and the remaining thirty in right of John Poyer: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey to the said Daniel the said two hundred acres of land now in his possession in Haverford as aforesaid and make returns thereof into the General Surveyors office at Philadelphia, where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee attested by the Secretary who is also to take a Duplicate of thy return into his office. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 18<sup>th</sup> of the 12<sup>th</sup> month 1701.
