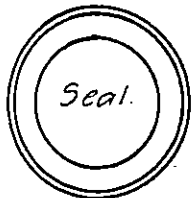

William Penn Absolute Proprietary & Govern^r in Chief of the Province
of Pensylvania & Counties annexed.

At the request of Cap^t Samuel Finney That I would grant him to take up the
Overplus land of the township of Taconicok Contiguous to the land late of Jacob
Hall reputed to be about one hundred acres These are to require thee forthwith
to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the sd Cap^t Finney the sd Overplus land
of Taconicok reputed to contain one hundred acres be it more or less, and
make returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given under my hand and
seal at Philadelphia the 22^d of ye 7th 1701.
