These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey the said tract according to the old lines and first bounds of survey and if it prove deficient of the sd quantity to make up the same out of such lands of the Prop<sup>rs</sup> as by adjacent or convenient for the sd purpose and make returns ~~into~~ of thy sd survey to the full complement of the quantity aforesaid into the Surveyor General's office at Philadelphia, where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>a</sup> the 4<sup>th</sup> of ye 3<sup>d</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1702.
