

Whereas Thomas fairman hath applyed himselfe to us for A patten for the Confirmation of his brothers land of 700 acres w<sup>ch</sup> he bought of Thomas Holme and was layed out by warrant from ye Comiss<sup>rs</sup> although after ward caueated by Joseph Growdon, but his right not appeareing to the Comiss<sup>rs</sup>, the Caueats were made voyd, therefore we order the Surveyor Gen<sup>l</sup> forthwith to make returns of the same into the Secretary's office and that a patten be accordingly given him now out of hand. as witness our hands this third day of the 3<sup>d</sup> mo. 1690.
