Whereas by our warrant dated y<sup>e</sup> first of this Inst<sup>t</sup>. We granted unto John Guest Esq to take up six hundred and sixty six acres of land and two thirds of an acre in right of Jm<sup>o</sup> Barber Original Purchase of two thousand five hundred acres w<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> quantity is designed to be laid out in y<sup>e</sup> County of Chester beyond Marlborough in y<sup>e</sup> road to Otteraroe. And whereas the s<sup>d</sup> John Guest hath requested us that we would grant him to take up three hundred and thirty three acres & one third more in the s<sup>d</sup> place to make up the afores<sup>d</sup> quantity one thousand acres for the convenience of two good settlers<sup>t</sup>, for w<sup>ch</sup> he hath agreed to pay two Bushels of Winter wheat for every hundred acres & so proportionably yearly. These therefore are to authorize and require thee to lay out to the s<sup>d</sup> John Guest in a distinct tract adjoining to the s<sup>d</sup> 666<sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> acres the s<sup>d</sup> quantity of Three hundred and thirty three acres & one third of an acre of land that hath not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians; ~~and~~ to be seated and improved within twelve months after y<sup>e</sup> date

hereof otherwise this grant to be utterly void, and make returns into the Gen<sup>l</sup> Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this warrant is to remain & a copy thereof to be deliv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by the Secretary Given under our hands and the seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> of 4<sup>th</sup> 1703.
