At the request of John Guest Esq That we would grant him to take up six hundred and sixty six acres and two thirds of an acre being one third of two thousand acres remaining untaken up of John Barbers original Purchase of two thousand five hundred acres w<sup>ch</sup> s<sup>d</sup> ~~part~~ Third part the s<sup>d</sup> John Guest hath Purchased of the s<sup>d</sup> Barbers Relict & sole Executrix Elizab Webb: These are ~~therefore~~ to authorize and require thee to survey and lay out to the said John Guest according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of six hundred and sixty six acres and two thirds of an acre of land that has not been already survey'd nor taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv<sup>d</sup> to thee certified by the Sec<sup>y</sup>. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> y<sup>s</sup> first of y<sup>s</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> 1770<sup>th</sup> 1703.
