

Pennsylvania.

By virtue of two warrants from ye Com^{rs} ye one dated ye 7th of ye 2^d mo. 1685 ye other dated ye 2^d of ye ffourth moneth 1685 directed to ye Survey^r Generall I do by authority from him certifie into ye Secretarys office that there was Surveyed and laid out ye 11th of ye 7th mo. 1685 unto Mary fincher, (The Relict of Francis fincher) nine hundred sixty ffive acres of land in ye County of Chester (ffour hundred and ninety acres where of is in right of Alexand^r Beardsl^y Purchas^r and ye remaining ffour hundred seventy and ffive acres is ye remaind^r of her late Husbands Purchass). Beginning at a Corn^r hickory tree thence running N. N. W. by Richard Smeeds land six hundred and ffourty perches, thence W. S. W. by a line of trees two hundred ffourty two perches to a Corn^r marked red oak, thence S. S. E. by a line of trees six hundred and ffourty two perches to ye place of beginning, which is accordingly certified & recorded in ye Survey^r Generalls office at Philadelphia ye 23^d 2^{mo} 1692.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this twentieth day of August 1909.
