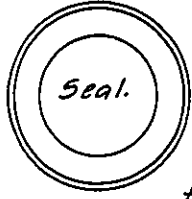

one hand and Allen ffoster and Benjamin Duffield on the other about ye line of
Division between their lands in Dublin township. These are to require thee forthwith
to resurvey or cause to be resurveyd, according to the first lines of survey and the
return thereof now in thy office, the whole tract claim'd by the said Allen ffoster
and Benjamin Duffield laid out on the 19th day of the 7th month 1682. for 500
acres by virtue of a warrant from my first Govern^r dated the 12th day of
the same month and year, and make exact returns thereof into my Secretaries
office I doe also hereby require and command all persons concerned to yield to
thee & thy Deputy and officers all due Compliance in ye Execution hereof as they
will answer the contrary at their peril. Given under my hand and seal at Philad^{ia}
ye 20th of ye 1^{mo} 1709.
