By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Richard Grafton of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up five hundred acres of land in the s^d. County ~~of Chester~~ — for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use fifty pounds for the whole and the usual yearly quitrents of one shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyd unto the said Rich^d Grafton in ~~the~~ ^{County} ~~Place~~ ^{said} ~~of~~ according to y^e Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a returne thereof into the Secretary's office, which survey in case the said Rich^d Grafton fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be valed otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warr^t ever granted Given under ~~our~~ ^{our} hands and seals of the Province at Philadelphia the 5th day of the ninth month Anno Dni 1714.
