At the request of George Fitzwater of the City of Philadelphia that we would grant him to take up in the said City the high street Lot belonging to the Original Purchase of five thousand acres of land made of the late Proprietary by George Palmer formerly of this Province deced. whose surviving Sons Thomas and William Palmer by their deeds dated the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December last past conveyed the said lot of ground unto the said George Fitzwater, These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said George Fitzwater in the High Street of the said City (where vacant) the said lot of ground in proportion to the purchase aforesaid and make returns thereof into the Secretary's office in order for a further confirmation. Given under our hands & ye lesser seal of ye Province at Philadelphia ye 10<sup>th</sup> day of ye 11<sup>th</sup> mo<sup>th</sup> 1770<sup>th</sup> A. D. 1770.

Returned into ye Secretary's office ye 16<sup>th</sup> of ye 5<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1784.
