At ye request of Francis Fincher Purchaser of one thousand two hundred & fifty  
acres, & in right of George Marris Purchaser of one thousand acres, yt I would  
grant him to take up his front lott on Skulkill side. These are to will & re-  
quire three forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be surveyd unto him a lott viz<sup>t</sup>  
ye upper Corner of Mulberry street proportionable to ye Quantity of land of ye  
two Purchases mention'd to w<sup>ch</sup> I add ten foot to him as a fitt being ye  
first that built upon Skulkill side in front together fifty five foot, & due length  
back & make returns thereof into my Secretary's office. Given at Philadelphia  
ye 25 of ye 5<sup>th</sup> 1683<sup>7</sup>
