 red forty seven foot, bound (obl.) w<sup>th</sup> John Swift's Lott eastward w<sup>th</sup> back Lotts  
 southward (obl) Walnut street formerly called Pool street westward w<sup>th</sup> ye sec<sup>tbl</sup>  
 street from Skoolkill And is accordingly, Entered & Recorded in my office  
 Philadelphia this 9<sup>th</sup> of the 4<sup>th</sup> month 1684.
