

Pursuant to a warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1701.

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Francis Rawle and Elizabeth Fox ~~and company~~ a certain tract of land commonly called Plymouth township scituate in the County of Philadelphia, beginning at a Birch tree marked standing by the River Skuylkill, being a corner dividing it from the land first laid out to Major Jasper Farmers and company, from thence by an old line of marked trees north east one thousand two hundred ninety and six perches to a corner marked white oak standing in the line of Whitpair's township, from thence by an old line of marked trees northwest seven hundred ninety and two perches to a corner hickory marked dividing this tract from Benjamin Chambers's land, from thence by an old line of marked trees south west eight hundred and forty perches to a corner marked hickory standing by the said river Skuylkill, from thence by the several courses thereof to the first mentioned birch tree, containing five thousand three hundred twenty seven acres and seventy nine perches of land. Surveyed the 29<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1701, and returned according to the abovesaid survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's office the 30<sup>th</sup> day of the 4<sup>th</sup> month 1701.
