At the request of William Garret of the County of Chester That we would grant him to take up forty^{two} acres of land due to him and remaining untaken up of William Neale Original Purchase of two hundred and fifty acres with the whole right of which purchase the said Will^{Garret} is invested. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed to the said William Garret according to the method of townships appointed the said quantity of forty two acres of land in this Province that has not been already surveyed nor is concealed nor sealed by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretaries office. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 24th day of the fifth month 1708.
