By the Commissioners of Property

At the request of William Grimson of the County of Chester that we would <sup>grant</sup> a survey on a hundred acres of land where he has seated himself near Octoraro Creek in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use twelve pounds money of this Province and the yearly quitrent of one shilling sterling. These are to authorize and require thee to survey or cause to be surveyed unto the said William Grimson in the place aforesaid the said quantity of one hundred acres of land that has not been already surveyed nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretary's Office which survey in case the said William fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valed otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month A.D. 1717.
