That we would grant him a survey on seven hundred acres of land in the Welch tract, part of w^{ch} hath been already survey'd and was by him purchased of Rich^d Thomas being part of the s^d Rich^ds ffathers original purchase of 5000 acres: These are to require thee to resurvey to the s^d Philip Howel, so much of the s^d land as has already been laid out, and to survey and lay out to the s^d Philip the Complett that shall appear upon thy s^d resurvey to be wanting of the s^d quantity of 700 acres of land in the s^d Welch tract where not already survey'd nor taken up and make returns into the General Surveyors office at Philad^{ia} where this warrant is to remain and a copy thereof to be delv^d to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands and ye seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 9th day of 9^{br} 1702.
