By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of George Burston. that we would Grant him to take up Either two, three or four hundred acres of Land in one Regular Tract in the Propriet^r's Mann^r of Gilberts adjoining to the Land late Evan Williams the East line thereof to Extend at Least four Hundr'd perches back from the River Schuylkill for which He hath agreed to pay to the Prop^r's use five and Twenty pounds Current Silver money of this Province and the Usual Yearly Quit-rent of one Shilling Sterling for Each hundred acres.

These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the Said George Burston the above mentioned Land in manner aforesaid and make a return thereof into the Secretarys Office in order to a further Confirmation. which Survey in case the said George Burston fulfill the above agreement within three months after Location shall be Vallid otherwise the Same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant Ever Granted. Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 19th day of the third Month 1714.
