These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in Right of the Said Enoch Flowers purchase the said Quantity of two hundred & fifty Acres of Land according to the Method of Townships appointed and that has not been already Survey'd nor Appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns there of into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation. Given under our Hands & the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 20<sup>th</sup> of of <sup>br</sup> 20<sup>th</sup> Anno Din. 1727.


