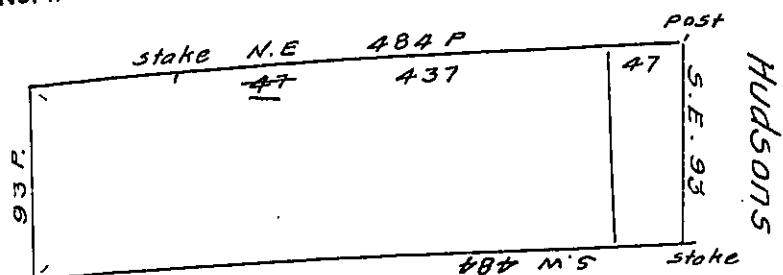

Beginning at a stake sett up in an old line hard by a marked white oak from thence N.E. by an old Line of marked trees 437 perches to a corner in the line.

Pursuant to a Warrant under ye hand & Seal of the Proprietary and Gov^r to me directed bearing date ye 3^d of ye 2^d m^o 1701. I Do hereby Certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto John Barnes a certain tract of Land Scituate in ye County of Philad^{ia} formerly laid out for two hundred forty & two acres. by virtue of a warrant from ye Proprietary & Governour in right of his Purchase of five hundred acres. but now found to contain two hundred eighty one acres & fifty two perches. Beginning at a stake sett up in an old line hard by a marked white oak from thence North East by an old line of marked trees four hundred eighty & four perches to a post sett in ye line of Thomas Hudson's Land, being also a Corner of Dennis Rockfords Land bounding upon this Tract. from thence by an old line of marked trees dividing it from said Hudsons Land South East ninety three perches to a stake sett up near a black oak marked from thence by a line of marked trees dividing it from ye Land of Sarah Delwin (late Fuller) South West four hundred eighty & four perches to a Corner marked hickery from thence North West by ^{an old} a line of marked trees ninety three perches to ye first mentioned Cor^r Stake. Containing as above expressed. Resurveyed ye 12th day of ye 3^d m^o 1701. And Returned according to ye above said Resurvey & bounds into ye Proprietary & Gov^rs Secretarys Office. the 20th day of ye 4th month 1701.
