

I do hereby Certifie That pursuant ~~to~~ a warrant under the hand and seal of Edward Penington, Surveyor General to David Powel Directed bearing date the 22<sup>d</sup> of the 10<sup>th</sup> month 1701 by vertue of the Proprietaries warrant to the said Edward Penington bearing date the same day the said David Powel hath made Return'd into the General Surveyors Office of the Survey of of a piece of land Survey'd to John Ball the 26<sup>th</sup> day of the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1702 which being Examined and Revised in the said office is as followeth viz.

The said land scituate in the liberties of the City Philadelphia on the west side of Schoolkill — beginning <sup>at</sup> a Red oak at the Corner of John Thomas his land from thence extending North by vacant land forty perches ~~to~~ to a black oak sapling Marked. from thence east eighty perches to a stake by Harford Road. thence South forty perches to a stake in the said John Thomas's line. from thence by the same west eighty perches to the place of beginning Containing twenty acres.
