At the Request of James Brook. That I would grant him and four of his Brothers and Sisters to take up seven Hundred and fifty Acres of Land in right of their Father John Brook, Purchaser in England. These are to will & require thee forthwith to Survey or cause to be Surveyed unto them the said Number of Acres of Land in this Province, not already taken up according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, and make returns there of to my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 18th day of the Third Month A.D. 1700.
