Upon an agreement now made with John Bull of Parqueamink for two, three or four hundred Acres of Land Situate in that part of the Mannor of Gilberts which makes a ^{late} Corner by the lines of the London Companys Land and the Land of Edward Lane for which he is to pay to the Proprietors use Thirty Pounds Money of this Province and the Yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred Acres which shall be laid out to him by Vertue hereof. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the said John Bull in the place aforesaid (joyning the same on the afor said lines where they meet) in one Regular Tract the Said quantity of two, three, or four hundred Acres of Land that is clear of all other Lawfull claims and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office. which Survey in case the said John fulfill the agreement within three Months after the date hereof shall be Valid, otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made, nor this Warrant ever granted.
