At the Request of Humphry Murry and John Budd both of the City of Philadelphia. That We would Grant them to take up the Proportion of Liberty Land belonging to the Original purchase of Five Thousand Acres made of the Proprietor by William Bacon of the Middle Temple Gen<sup>t</sup> by Deeds of Lease & Release dated ye 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> dayes of October 1681. who by like Deeds dated ye 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> days of ye Month called Febr'y last past Granted the whole Five Thousand Acres unto the said Humphry Murry & John Budd together with ye Lotts & Liberty Land thereunto belonging. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Humphrey Murry & John Budd in ye Liberties of ye said City (if there to be found Vacant) the said proportion of Liberty Land to contain (if on this side of ye River Schuylkill) Eighty acres or on the West side of ye River one hundred Acres. That has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated and make Returns there of into ye Secretarys Office in order for a further Confirmation. Given under our hands & the Seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the 5<sup>th</sup> day of ye Third Month Anno Din. 1719.
