At the Request of Squire Boon of the County of Philadelphia that we would Grant him to take up the quantity of two Hundred & fifty Acres of Land in part of five Hundred Acres the Original purchase made of the late Propriet<sup>r</sup> William Penn Esq<sup>r</sup> by John Millington of Shrewsbury in the County <sup>of</sup> Salop Baker by Deeds of Lease & Release dated the 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> days of August Anno. — 1682. the Right to which said two Hundred & fifty Acres by sundry Mesire Conveyances being now Vested in the said <sup>Squire</sup> Boon. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in Right of the said purchase According to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of two Hundred & fifty acres that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Return thereof into the Secretarys Office. Given under our Hands and the lesser Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 30<sup>th</sup> day of Decemb<sup>r</sup> A. D. 1730.
