That we would Grant him to take up five hundred Acres of Land in this Province for which he Hath agreed to pay to the Prop^rs use fifty pounds and the usual Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for Each hundred ^l Annum. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd to the Said Edw^d Bennett according to the Method of Townships Appointed the Said Quantity ~~of~~ of five Hundred Acres of Land in the Said Province that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians. And make a Returne there of into the Secretarys Office in Order to a further Confirmation. Which Survey in case the Said Edward fulfill the afore said Agreement within three Month after Location shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant Ever Granted. Given under our hands and the Seale of this Province at Philadelphia the 27th of the first Month 1714.
