By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Peter Bizailon That We would Grant him to take up for the use of Martha his Wife <sup>Daughter of John Comb of Philadelphia</sup> the Quantity of Seven hundred Acres of Land on or near the River Sasquahannah at the place where Nathl Christophers Sometime Dwelt; for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Proprietary Trustees Seventy pounds Mony of Pensilva for the whole and the Yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each hundred Acres. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Martha the wife of Peter Bizailon at the Place aforesaid including an Improvement there already made and to extend the same as far back from the Said River into the Woods as the place will reasonably bear) the said quantity of Seven hundred Acres of Land that is clear of all other Surveys & lawfull claimes and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the Said Peter or Martha his Wife comply with the above agreement by paying the said sum of Seventy pounds within three Months after ye date hereof shall be Valid. otherwise the same is to be utterly Void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 25<sup>th</sup> day of ye first Mo<sup>th</sup> Anno. Di. 1719.
