Whereas John Burge, Original Purchaser of Seven hundred and fifty Acres of Land in this Province did in his life time obtain a Survey on & take up two certain Tracts of Land in right of his sd purchase in the Township of Haverford within the Bounds of the Welch Tract and in ye County of Chester, the one containing as tis said about 260 Acres & the other laid out for 250. And whereas ~~William~~ William Burge son & Will<sup>m</sup> Trent son in Law to the sd Jn<sup>o</sup> Burge deceased hath made application to us for ye remainder yet untaken up of the said Purchase. These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee exactly to resurvey the two said Tracts of Land Scituate as afore sd according to their true Metes & Bounds & Original Lines of Survey. And after Allowance made of ten Acres for every Hundred of the said Tracts (if so much be found therein above ye quantities they were respectively laid out for) to Survey and lay out to the sd William Burge and William Trent the full Complim<sup>t</sup> and Remainder of the sd Purchase of 750 Acres of Land within the Bounds of the sd Welch Tract not already Survey'd or taken up by others, if conveniently to be had, or if not in any other ~~place~~ place in the Province being not concealed or seated by ye Indians, and make Returns into the General Surveyors Office at Philad<sup>ia</sup> where this Warr<sup>t</sup> is to remain and a Copy there of to be delvd to thee certified by ye Secretary. Given under our hands & ye Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> 24<sup>th</sup> of 9<sup>br</sup> 1702.
