

By virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property dated the 24th day of the 9th Month Anno 1702. There was Surveyd and Laid out to William ^{Burge} and William Trent two hundred and Eighty nine Acres of Land (being the Remainder untaken up of Seven hundred and fifty acres purchased by John Burge) Within the Bounds of the Welch Tract in the County of Chester. Beginning at a post at a Corner of Richard Jones's Land. Thence West South West by the same one hundred and twenty four perches to a Corner of Henry Sanders his Land. Then by the same North North West three hundred seventy four perches to a Line of David Jones his Land. Then by the same and the land of Owen Thomas ^{E.N.E.} One hundred and twenty four pches. Then by a Tract of Land formerly layd out to Ed. Pritchard and Comp. South South East three — seventy four pches to the place of Beginning. Surveyd the 25th of the 8th Month 1703. and Returned into the General Office of Survey by David Powel, Surveyor.
