

The land laid out for thomas brasee formerly called diamands land in the township of Chester begineth at a corner marked black oake standing @ Chester Creek side being also a corner tree of George Churchmans land then down ye severall Courses of ye sd Creek to a marked corner spanish oake (being a corner tree of y^t which was formerly called upland bounds from thence N.E. b. E. 345 perch to a corner post being a corner of ye ten acres formerly granted @ ye governor for ye use of ye burring ground from thence N.W. b. N. 50 perch^{ch} to a corner post standing by ridly Creek) then up ye severall Courses thereof to a marked corner red oake from thence S.W. b. W. 144 perch along ye line of Isack fen to a corner marked black oake being a corner tree of ye above^{sd} Churchmans land from thence S.E. b. E. 17 perch & a halfe to a marked corner hickery from thence S.W. b. W. 189 perch to ye first mentioned black oake. Containing in the whole ninty four acres & ~~three~~ 3 quarters.
