By vertue of a war^t from ye ^{Com G.} ~~Survey of Survey~~ dated ye 24th 7th mo. 1684 directed to ye Surveyer^s Generall. I do by Authority from him Certifie into ye Secretaryes office that there was Surveyed and Laid out ye same day unto Thomas Bond (Purchas^r of 1000 acres) his Lott in ye Libertyes of Philadelphia proportionable there to. Begining at a Corn^r post of Francis Doves Land. Thence N.N.W by ye same 72 perches. thence W.b.N by Jn^o Moons Land 39 p^{ches}. thence S.S.E. by a line of trees 93 perches from thence E.N.E. by a line of trees 32 perches to ye place of begining. Containing Sixteen acres of Land which is accordingly Entred and Recorded in ye Survey^r Generalls Office at Philadelphia ye 6th of ye 8th mo 1691.
