

Surveyd and laid out the 29th day of the first Month Anno 1718 by Virtue of a Warrant from the Commiss^{rs} of Property Dated the 21st of the fourth Month 1717 unto Richard Anderson of the County of Chester a Tract of Land in the Township of White-land in the said County. Beginning at a Corner Marked Black Oak in a line of David Meridiths Land thence South twenty four degrees Easterly by the said Merideths land Seventy four perches to a black oak. Thence North eighty three deg^s. easterly One hundred Seventy eight perches to a White oak. Thence North twenty four degrees West by the land of William Smith One hundred twenty six perches to a Corner post. Thence South Sixty Six degrees West by the Land of Daniel Worthington One hundred and seventy perches to the place of Beginning. Containing One hundred acres with the usual allow^{ance} ~~of~~ of Six & Cent.

Returned into the Secretarys Office the 3^d of the 3^d Month 1718.
