Surveyed for Samuell Bradshaw 250 acres of Land lying in the township of Darby begining at a marked white oak standing by Darby creek side and runing E.N.E. 122 petch to a marked post and from thence S.S.E. 16 petch to a marked post and from thence E.N.E. 390 petch to a marked red oak standing by Mill Creek then doune the 5^d creek ~~to~~ on severall courses to ~~the~~ a marked white oak being the corner tree of John Blunstone land and along the 5^d Blunstone line W.S.W. 420 petch to a marked post from thence N.N.W. 72 petch to a marked post from thence W.S.W. 130 petch to a white oak standing by Darby Creek and from thence up the 5^d creek on severall coarses to the first menched white oak.
