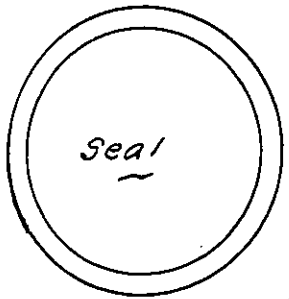

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern^r in
Chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties annexed

At the Request of Phineas Pemberton That I would grant him
a Resurvey on a certain Tract of Land in Bristol Township in the County
of Bucks formerly laid out by virtue of my Warr^t to John Green on new
Rent for one hundred Acres but now by good deeds of Bargain and Sale
in the lawful possession of the s^d Phineas Pemberton: Also on another Tract
in the same Township adjoining on y^e former reputed to contain 203 Acres
193 thereof formerly laid out to Ralph Smith in a Tract of 293 Acres, & y^e
other 10 Acres to William Dungan in a Tract of 100 Acres, both w^{ch} parcels are
now ^{also} in the said Phineas his lawful Possession: These are to require thee forth-
with to Resurvey or cause to be Resurveyd ~~and~~ the said Tracts of one hundred
and of two hundred and three Acres according to their ~~the~~ Boundaries and first lines
of Survey and make exact Returns of the same in one Tract, into my Secretaries Office
Given under my hand & seal at Philadelphia the 11th day of the 11th moth 170⁹
