



Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General dated 1 day of the 2 month 1701 to resurvey unto John Rowland two Tracts of Land situate in the County of Bucks wch said Tracts are contiguous and Beging at a corn<sup>r</sup> post being a corn<sup>r</sup> of Edmnd Lovet's Land Thence South east by east one hundred ninety three perches to a red oak Then by Edward Wantons Land South forty seven degrs west forty two perches <sup>to red oak</sup> Then by said Wantons Land South South east Two hundred forty seven perches to a post and a bl oak marked neare by for a corn<sup>r</sup> Then by Phineas Pemberton's Land west South west sixty four perches to a post and a smal hickery in a swamp marked for a corn<sup>r</sup> Then by Daniel Smith's Land north north west one hundred ninety two perches to a small maple Then by Charles Lavelley's Land north west by west one hundred ninety two perches to a Spanish oak Then by John headleys Land north thirty six degrs east forty five perches to a post Then north Twenty five degrs west to a maple in a creek Ten perches Then by the Courses of the Creeke as layd down in the figure hereunto annexed including the Creeke in the said Rowlands Land to a post Then still continuing by said headleys Land north forty three degrs east fifty two perches to the place of Beging Containeing Two hundred thirty nine acres Resurveyed & Certified the 31 day of the 1 month 1701 P
