



By virtue of a warrant from the com^{rs} of property bearing Date the 12th day of the 2nd month 1703 and by virtue of an order from Jacob Taylor grounded upon the said warrant to me directed ^{being dat. the 12th of May 1725} Requesting me to Resurvey a certain Tract of Land Belonging to Alexander Parker containing one Thousand fifty and five acres and an half in Bucks County beginning at a marked whit oak being the Corner of Samuel Carpen^{tr} deceased corner now William Fishburns Land and then north West four hundred and ten perches to a Spanish oak marked with SC by the said Fishburns Land then north east by a Line of marked trees four hundred and twelve perches to a small black oak for a corner standing in the Line of the Land Lot of Nathan Stanberry then by the said Stanberry's Land and others South east four hundred and ten perches to a post standing by a great whit oak then South West four hundred and twelve perches ^{by the Line of Warminster Township} by the Land of William Stockdell and Gilbert, to the place of beginning Resurveyed the the fourteenth day of the third month in the yeare one thousand seven hundred and ^{twenty} five By me
