 dat the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June anno<sup>d</sup> 1725 in pursuance of a Warrant from the  
 Commissioners of Property Dated the 20<sup>th</sup> Day the 3<sup>d</sup> month 1725 Surveyed  
 this Tract of Land unto Edward Shippen Beginning at a post in Richard  
 Hills Land Line being a corner of Joseph Kirkbride's Land and then  
 north west by the side Joseph's Land one hundred and sixty perches  
 to a great whit oak then north east three hundred fifty and six  
 perch by vacand Land to a Spanish oak then South East one  
 hundred and sixty perch by vacand Land to a post then South  
 west by vacand and Richard Hills Land three hundred fifty and  
 six perch to the place of beginning Containing three hundred  
 fifty and six Acres lying allowed six acres to the hundred for high  
 ways as usual surveyed the twelfth day of June in one thousand seven  
 hundred and twenty five 1725 In Bucks County near Plumstead Township By me
