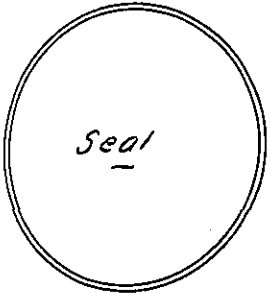


Pennsylvania 55



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Edward Roberts of the County of Bucks that We would Grant him to take up Two Hundred and fifty acres of Land ⁱⁿ that place called the great Swamp in the said County for which he agrees to pay to the Proprietors use Seven & thirty pounds ten shillings for the whole and the usual yearly quit rent of one Shilling Sterling for Each Hundred acres and in proportion for the fifty acres. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Edward Roberts in the place aforesaid according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of Two Hundred & fifty acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office W^{ch} Survey in case the said Edward fulfill the above agreem^t within three Months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be ^{void} as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 17th day of the 9th month Anno Dⁿⁱ 1715
