At ye Request of Thomas Fairman in Right of W<sup>m</sup> Stanly purchaser of 5000 acres of Land haveing purchased of ye said Stanly four thousand acres thereof and sold of ye said four thousand two hundred acres unto John Swift: That wee would grant unto John Swift a warr<sup>t</sup> ff<sup>r</sup> ye takeing up ye said two hundred acres in Liew of a warr<sup>t</sup> ff<sup>r</sup> former (ob1) ranted unto ye said faireman ff<sup>r</sup> 200 - acres bearing date ye 31<sup>st</sup> of 3<sup>rd</sup> mo 1689 - w<sup>ch</sup> warr<sup>t</sup> is said to be lost to be Laid in ye County of Bucks.

These are therefore in ye Proprietarys name to will and Require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto ye said John Swift ye said Number of acres in ye ff<sup>r</sup>esaid County where not already taken up he seating and Improveing ye same within six months after ye Date of Survey and ~~and~~ make Return thereof to ye Secretarys Office Dated at Philad ye 13 of ye 10<sup>th</sup> mo 1690.
