



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Commissioners to me directed bearing date the first day of the 2<sup>d</sup> month 1702 Surveyed and laid out unto Randal Spireman in Right of Daniel Smyth deceased A Tract of Land in Soulbury Township in Bucks County Beginning at a Post in Stephen Beak's line at William Croasdale's Corner, Thence by the said Croasdale's land N.E. 338 perches to a small black oak, Then by Bassillean Foster, George Pownel and Vacant Land South 478 perches to a Post, Then by Vacant S.W. 109 perches to a Post by a black oak, Then N.W. by Vacant 217 perches to a Post in the said Beak's line, Then by the same N.E. 106 perches to a Post by 3 poplars upon one Foot, Then N.W. 119 perches to the place of beginning Containing 500 Acres, Surveyed the 15<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month 1702.
