



Pursuant to a Warrant to me directed by Edward Pennington
 Surveyor General dated the 2nd day of the 5th month 1700 Laid out unto John
 Smith in Right of Thomas Rowland one Tract of Land in the County of Bucks.
 Beginning at a white oak being a corner of the Land formerly Francis Rossills
 Then north west by vacant Land five hundred forty six perches to a heape of stones.
 Then north east by vacant Land one hundred perches to a post then by land
 left for a Road south east one hundred and six perches to a post then south
 west by vacant Land twenty perches to a post Then south east by vacant Land
 ninety six perches to a stone. Then south west forty perches by the said John
 Smiths Land to a post Then by the said John Smiths Land Southeast three hundred forty four
 perches to a post Then by Land incognita south west forty perches to the place of Beginning Containing
 Two hundred acres of Land surveyed and certified the 7th day of the 3 month
 one thousand seven hundred and one 1701 p.
