

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hands of Griffith Owen Thomas Story and James Logan the Prop^{rs} and Governors Commissioners of Property and the seal of the Province dated the 18th day of the 12th month 1701 Granting a Resurvey on twelve hundred acres of Land in the possession of Rebecca Shippen belonging to the Estate of her former husband Francis Richardson situate in Wrightstown in the County of Bucks eleven hundred forty and four acres thereof adjoining on Newtown Line and the lands now or late of Joseph Amber and John Chapman and the Remaining fifty six acres Lying in Common in the Townstead of Wrightstown afores^d.

Resurveyd unto Rebecca Shippen a Tract of Land in Wrightstown and Makefield in the County of Bucks beginning at black oak at the side of Wrightstown Park being the corner of John Chapman's land from thence by the said Park north east one hundred and sixteen perches to a black oak from thence by Joseph Amber Land north east by east three hundred and thirty ^{perches} to a black oak Then by the out bounds of Wrightstown Southeast two hundred and twenty perches to a black oak at the corner of the said Township from thence north east by vacant Land three hundred and two perches to a post by a small Run of Water between a black oak & a white oak both marked for a corner Then south east by John Baldwin's land four hundred and five perches to a black oak Then by Joseph Milner's land south west two hundred and fifty two perches - a Hickery tree at the head of a spring Then north sixty nine degrees west by Vacant Land at the head of Newtown Lots four hundred forty four perches to a small Hickery tree in Wrightstown bounds Then south west twenty eight perches to a black oak at another corner of the said Chapman's land Then by the 5^d land west four hundred and four perches to the place of Beginning Containing one thousand three hundred and twenty one acres with fifty six
