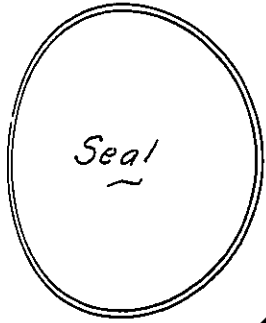

William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Governour in Chief
of the Province of Pensilvania and Countys Annexed.

Whereas there is a Controversy depending between Jn^o. Snowden
Peter Worrall and others concerning a certain Tract of Land Scituate in
Maklefield Township in the County of Bucks of which they are at p^{re}sent
possess'd reputed to contain about six hundred acres formerly in the oc-
cupation of William Venables. These are at the Request of the said Jn^o.
Snowdon and Peter Worrall ^{to require thee} to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd the said
Tract forthwith according to its first Bounds and Lines of Survey, also to
run a Division Line through the same by the Bounds of the several parcels
of the said Tract claimed by the s^d Jn^o. Snowden and Peter Worrall and make
Returns thereof into my Secretaries Office Given under my Hand and Seal
at Philadelphia the 31st of the first Month 1701
