*At the Request of John Smith of the County of Bucks Blacksmith That I would grant him to take up Two Hundred Acres of Land in right of In<sup>o</sup> Rowland old Purchaser. These are to require thee forthwith to survey or cause to be surveyed unto him the said Number of Acres in the County of Bucks of Land not already taken up, according to the Method of Townships by me appointed, and make returns thereof into my Secretaries office. Given at Philadelphia the 20<sup>th</sup> day of the second month, in y<sup>e</sup> year 1700.*
