

I do hereby Certifie That pursuant to a warrant under the hands of the Commissioners of Propertie and the seal of the Province to Phineas Pemberton directed bearing date the 21<sup>st</sup> day of the 11<sup>th</sup> mo. 1701 and by vertue of a warrant from the said Commissioners to John Cutler bearing date the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 170 $\frac{1}{2}$  authorizing him to execute all warrants directed to the said Phineas Pemberton. The said Jn<sup>o</sup> Cutler hath made Returns into the General Surveyors office <sup>of</sup> the Resurvey of a piece of Land Resurveyd to John Tatham the 18<sup>th</sup> day of the first month 1701 which being examined and (oblit'd) in the said office is as followeth viz:

Scituate in Bensalem Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a Corner marked black oak at the mouth Samuel Allen's Creek From thence extending up the said Creek north west forty six perches to a white oak thence north by Samuel Allen his land and by Joseph Growden his great Tract five hundred fifty six per<sup>s</sup> to a white oak from thence east north east three hundred and sixty perches to a Birch tree by Nestramenah Creek thence down the severall courses of the 5<sup>d</sup> Creek nine hundred and seventy five perches to the place of Beginning Containing one thousand and twenty acres.
