red Acres above ye Falls behinde ye Purchasers, in a place where not already  
taken up according to ye Method of Townships concluded on, & this shall  
be thy Warrant. Given at Philadelphia ye 30<sup>th</sup> of ye 11<sup>th</sup> Mo. 1682.
