



By virtue of a Warrant from the Proprietaries Comm^{rs} to me directed bearing date the 18th 1st 1703. Surveyed and Laid out unto Francis White (in right of his father George White original purchaser of 2500 acres in this Province) a Tract of Land in Soulbury township in Bucks County Beginning at a black oak sapling att Samuel Beaks Corner, Thence by the said Samuel Beaks line North West one hundred and eighty perches to a small white oak, Then by vacant Land North East two hundred twenty two perches and an halfe to a Post, Then by Jeremiah Langhorne's land South East one hundred and eighty perches to a Post by a white oak in William Croasdale's line, Then by the said Will^m Croasdale and Stephen Beaks land South West two hundred twenty two perches and an halfe to the place of beginning Containing 250 Acres. Laid out the 30th 1st 1703
