



Resurveyed the 3<sup>d</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month 1702, unto Edward Wanton at the request of Tobias Dymock Attorney to the said Edward Wanton A Tract of Land in Bristol Township in the County of Bucks Beginning at a black oak sapling marked for a corner standing by the River Delaware being the Corner of Phineas Pemberton's land, Thence by the S<sup>d</sup> land N. 47 deg. E. 45 per. to a Corner marked Red Oak, Then by John Rowland's land N. 47 deg. E. 45 per. to a Red Oak marked for a Corner, Then by Edmund Lovet's Job Buntin's and Joseph Large's Land S. S. E. 765 per. to a Corner marked black oak by the S<sup>d</sup> River, Then down the same S. 31 deg. W. 51 per. to the place of beginning Resurveyed.
