



According to a warrant to me directed by Edward Penington Surveyor General bearing date the 6th day of the 2nd month 1700 Surveyed & layd out unto Thomas Parsons a Tract of Land Lying in the County of Bucks begining at a small white oak being the Corner of James Streators Land Thence by Margret Atkinson and William Coopers Lands north west 215 perches ^{to a heap of stones} Thence by land untaken up north east 372 1/2 perches to a small Chesnut Tree Thence by Land untaken up South east 215 perches to a post being another corner of the said Streators Land Thence by the said Streators Land south West 372 1/2 perches to the first mentioned Corner Tree Containeing five hundred acres of Land the 21 day of the 6th mo 1700 p.
