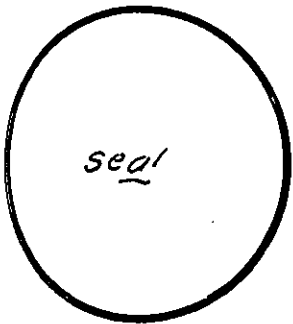


Pensilvania }

surveyed the said Tract according to its first Lines and Bounds of Survey.  
Also to survey or cause to be surveyed a certain small Tract of Vacant Marsh adjoin-  
ing on the said Land reputed to contain about six acres And make distinct Re-  
turns of both the s<sup>d</sup> Tracts into the Secretaries Office. Given under our Hands  
and y<sup>e</sup> seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 24<sup>th</sup> day of November in y<sup>e</sup> year One  
thousand seven hundred and one.
